- A very good knowledge of French and English is expected.
- Experience with primary data collection (e.g. interviews, focus groups) is an asset but no must.
- Willingness to travel to and in Côte d'Ivoire for field research is expected.

- (Co-) Supervision for the completion of the Master thesis will be provided by ZALF.
- Travel costs relating to the Master thesis research will be covered by project funding.
