

The mission of the Leibniz Centre for Agricultural Landscape Research (ZALF) e. V., as a nationally and internationally active research centre, is to conduct research into the economically, ecologically and socially sustainable agriculture of the future – in collaboration with stakeholders from science, politics and practice. ZALF is a member of the Leibniz Association and, in addition to its main location in Müncheberg (approx. 35 minutes by regional train from Berlin-Lichtenberg), has further locations in Dedelow and Paulinenaue.

The working group Sustainable Land Use in Developing Countries (SusLAND) focusses on the analysis of land use and landscape systems in emerging and developing countries. Based on the analyses, interdisciplinary research methods are used to develop strategies to mitigate complex problems of farming systems in developing countries at local, regional and global scales. Emphasis is placed on questions regarding the avoidance of land use conflicts, the improved adaptation to climate change, food and nutrition security, and the stabilization of the livelihood of family farms.

We are offering a stipend to cover the costs for adoption studies on food security and resilience in the Global South, specifically in the Middle East. The stipend will be given to compensate the costs for conducting research and processing the related data.
